## FRATELLI TUTTI

POPE FRANCIS'S NEW encyclical *Fratelli tutti* is a call for everyone to see the world as being without borders and view everyone as their brothers and sisters, says Catholic Archbishop of Wellington, Cardinal John Dew.

"*Fratelli tutti* is a profound document," says Cardinal Dew, vice-president of the NZ Catholic Bishops Conference. "It can change minds and hearts. It can be one avenue to do nothing less than 'renew the face of the Earth.' Take it and pray."

Pope Francis signed *Fratelli tutti* at the weekend after celebrating Mass at the tomb of St Francis of Assisi. It is the third encyclical of his pontificate and focuses on friendship and human solidarity at this time of international pandemic and polarisation. The title has been translated from the Latin as *Brothers and Sisters All*, a key phrase in the document.

Cardinal Dew says *Fratelli tutti* is not about making adjustments here and there to our personal and community lives. "Rather it is very much about a way to re-read and to live the Gospel of our times. The Pope writes about the need for us to survive not only the coronavirus pandemic, but the many other things our contemporary world needs to do to survive. It is that serious. It is that compelling. It is that demanding."

*Fratelli tutti* pleads on behalf of the world's poor, the handicapped, the infirm and the elderly - people who often live on the margins of society but who ought to be at the centre, says Cardinal Dew. "This is an invitation for everyone to broaden our perspective to view a world without borders and to view every single person on the planet, and yes, the planet itself, as brother and sister."

Pope Francis wants to offer "a new vision of fraternity and social friendship that will not remain on the level of words," says Cardinal Dew. "As we would say today, he wants us to walk the walk, not just talk the talk. It is a primer on the Catholic Christian way of viewing life and living life in dialogue among all people of good will." (Quotes from the past)

**"Give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's. – Mt 22:21 [Gospel]"**



**T**HE COIN BEARING Caesar's likeness and inscription must be given to Caesar, and the one stamped with the divine image and likeness must be given to God. "We bear the imprint of your glorious face, O Lord."

We are made in the "image and likeness of God." So you, O Christian, because you are a human being, are God's tribute money - a little coin bearing the image and likeness of the divine emperor. Therefore with Christ I ask, "whose likeness and inscription is this?" Your answer is, God's. To which I reply, Then why not give God what belongs to him?

If we really want to be God's image, we must be like Christ, for his is the image of God's goodness and "the perfect copy of his nature," and God "foreordained that those he has chosen should take on a likeness to his son." - **St Lawrence of Brindisi, Opera omnia 8**

- 6) Communion on the hand only. If you wish to receive Communion on the tongue, please come up last in the queue for Holy Communion.
- 7) Please note that there is dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass should you feel you have any health related concerns. **If you are feeling unwell, please refrain from getting to church.**



## Recipients of Your Mission Gifts 2019 - 2020



**Mass Intentions** requested by donors are sent to priests in the mission territories who celebrate the Masses. The stipend (gift) helps priests maintain themselves.




## OCTOBER - MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY


