
## The Kingdom of God is near

WE ARE CALLED AND sent to bring the deep peace of the kingdom of God into the world. The prophet Isaiah (**First Reading**) proclaims a joyful time of peace that flows like a river from the healing, comforting love of God, which is compared to the intimate, tender bond between a mother and a baby.

The same spirit of contented happiness is reflected in today's **Psalms** of jubilation, where the whole earth cries out with joy to the Lord. The members of the Early Church community in Galatia are encouraged to be at peace with one another through Christ who makes us a new creation in him. Christ is the source of all peace and unity in the world (**Second Reading**).

In the **Gospel**, Jesus sends seventy-two of his followers ahead of him. He is confident that they will have all they need for their mission through all they have learnt from following his way. He instructs them to bring his peace and healing into the communities that they visit.

In a world that cries out more than ever for the peace of Christ, especially for the people of Ukraine, this is our calling today. Jesus stands among us and sends us before him, to declare his peace and to heal and encourage people in the knowledge that the Kingdom of God is very near. Let us pray that the whole Christian community will joyfully answer this call.



## EVER ANCIENT, EVER NEW

(Quotes from the past)

**"Your peace will rest on him"** (Lk 10:6)



**T**HIS HARVEST IS THE people to whom the prophets preached, sowing the seed so that the apostles might gather in the sheaves. For the seed to sprout it was sufficient for the prophets to sow, but the ripe grain had to wait for the apostles' sickle.

Another time the Lord told his disciples: "You say that summer is still far off. Lift up your eyes and see that the fields are already white with ripe grain!" And he added: "Others have toiled over it, and you have entered into their labours."

Those others were Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, and the prophets. Because they worked hard at sowing, at the Lord's coming the grain was found to be ripe. Then the reapers were sent out, wielding the Gospel as their sickle. They were to greet no one on the road, which meant they were to have no aim or activity apart from proclaiming the Good News in a spirit of brotherly love.

When they arrived at a house they were to say: "Peace be to this house." This greeting was no mere formula; being filled with peace themselves, the apostles spread it abroad, proclaiming peace and at the same time possessing it. Consequently when one of them, fully at peace with himself, pronounced the blessing: "Peace be to this house," then if a lover of peace were in that house, the apostle's peace would rest upon him. - **St Augustine of Hippo, Sermon 101**

## TE ARA A MARIA HIKOI

### Visit to Our Lady of Hope Parish, Tawa-Titahi Bay

IN 1838 AT the first Catholic Mass, Bishop Pompallier dedicated New Zealand to Our Lady Assumed into Heaven when he celebrated his first Mass here at Totara Point in the Hokianga on 13 January 1838.

In 2020 the New Zealand Bishops discussed plans to establish a National Shrine honouring Our Lady with a suitable artwork of Our Lady. This artwork, (below), is nearing the end of a hikoi around NZ and will be permanently located at St Mary of the Angels church which will become a national shrine to Mary.

Our parish will be hosting the icon from 15-18 July and we invite as many parishioners and friends to take the time to visit. It is hoped that this is an opportunity to provide people with inspiration to be refreshed and revitalized in their faith and their connection to Our Lady as Patroness of Aotearoa.
