

Our Not-So-Separate Lives

HE EASTER SEASON that ends today could be seen as an extended celebration of our Baptism, our incorporation into the mystical Body of Christ. In the *Invocation of the Saints* that forms part of the Rite of Baptism, the congregation is asked to reply "Pray for us!"

The Invocation could teach us two things: first, there is an afterlife. Death is not the end of everything. Our Faith teaches us that the saints are alive before God and are aware of what is happening around us. Remember the Transfiguration event? Jesus was seen talking to Moses and Elijah! And the book of Revelation describes the angels and the saints interceding for us who are still labouring here on earth.

Second, it reminds us that Christian life is not a life in isolation. Even those homebound for some valid reasons, like monks and hermits united by the bonds of faith and charity, can still offer their prayers and sacrifices for the world and for the universal Church.

Thus, with all the saints and the living and the departed we, as a Church, gather every Sunday in sacred communion, as we support one another through corporal and spiritual works of mercy and charity.

Venerable Fulton Sheen once said, "To materialists this world is opaque like a curtain; nothing can be seen through it. A mountain is just a mountain, a sunset just a sunset; but to poets, artists, and saints, the world is transparent like a window pane—it tells of something beyond: a mountain tells of the Power of God, the sunset of His Beauty, and the snowflake of His Purity." I think, if we really see the Church as it truly is—not just a gathering of people but the Mystical Body of Christ animated by the Holy Spirit—

we can do greater things!






ST THOMAS MORE SOCIETY, WELLINGTON
