Living a Trinitarian Life

HAVE BEEN TO prison a number of times. From July until December as seminarians, we would do prison visits every Sunday to talk to the inmates about the Faith.

Since our visits coincided with family hours, we were unable to use the communal hall and so one or two seminarians would be locked up in the cells with about 30 other inmates. It was not scary, to be honest. They were very welcoming and respectful. Each cell has an elected "mayor" who kept order and discipline. Philippine prisons are different from other countries. Not everyone in jail are guilty; some are in due to false accusations, political beliefs, poverty (unable to pay *fianza*, or bail bond).

To most of the inmates, the hardest punishment was not the physical labour or discomfort in the crowded humid cells. It was solitary confinement. No contact with fellow prisoners or family visits.

Seminary life is sometimes mistaken as a quasi-prison. Some young people would say to us, "I don't want to be a priest because it must be a lonely life." I always reply, "Any person, priest or not, can feel lonely at times even if surrounded by family and friends. It is what you do with your life that could make all the difference."

These sentiments underline one of the basic needs of humanity: we need community. Of course, an introvert can be a priest or can raise a family if he knows what real love is, which brings us to this Sunday's **Solemnity of the Holy Trinity**: God is love (1 Jn 4:8, 16). For love to be real, it has to *proceed* away from itself. Love has to have an object other than itself. Thus, we say in the Creed that the Holy Spirit *proceeds* from the Father and the Son. As the Gospel today shows, a

person who loves is a person who serves and is willing to sacrifice. That is why we say God, the Holy Trinity, is *the* community of love. That, too, is the life we must live as a parish.

EVER ANCIENT, EVER NEW

"The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all." 2 Cor 13:13 [Second Reading]



VEN THE GIFTS that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs also to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father. Similarly, when the Spirit dwells in us, the Word who bestows the Spirit is in us too, and the Father is present in the Word. This is the meaning of the text: *My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him.* For where the light is, there also is the radiance; and where the radiance is, there too are its power and its resplendent grace.

This is also Paul's teaching in his second letter to the Corinthians: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. For grace and the gift of the Trinity are given by the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. Just as grace is given from the Father through the Son, so there could be no communication of the gift to us except in the Holy Spirit. But when we share in the Spirit, we possess the love of the Father, the grace of the Son and the fellowship of the Spirit himself. - St Athanasius, Letter to Serapion
