June: the Humility of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

N OUR LITURGICAL calendar, we dedicate the month of June to the **Sacred Heart of Jesus**, simply because its Solemnity is celebrated during this month. This year 2023 the solemnity, which falls on the Friday after the Corpus Christi Sunday, will be celebrated on 16 June.

The statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is usually depicted as he appeared to St Margaret Alacoque in June 1675: with his heart on fire visible outside his chest, surrounded by a crown of thorns. When Jesus appeared to St Margaret, He asked, among other things, that the devotion be a special form of reparation for the indignities the Eucharist suffered.

After some period of hesitation and examination, as the Church often does in similar cases to "test the spirits to see whether they are from God" (cf 1 Jn 4:1-6), Rome finally granted its approval in 1765. Sister Margaret Mary was canonised on 13 May 1920 by Pope Benedict XV.

Having to celebrate Corpus Christi and Sacred Heart in the same week is providential, if we look at it in view of sacred history. In the **Solemnity of Corpus Christi** we celebrate and profess our belief, publicly, as a community, that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist: Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. It is still common in other countries to hold a Eucharistic procession along the main streets as a form of public profession of belief in the Real Presence.

Truly, the month of June is special to us: the *Sacred Heart*, a symbol of God's burning love for us as shown by his humiliating death on the cross; and the *Eucharist* where we receive Jesus in the humble appearance of Bread and Wine. The Gospel on 16 June hints at a

response: Come to me ... for I am gentle and humble of heart, and you will find rest."

Feast of Corpus Christi



NDER THE OLD law it was the flesh of calves and goats that was offered, but here Christ himself, the true God, is set before us as our food. What could

be more wonderful than this? No other sacrament has greater healing power; through it sins are purged away, virtues are increased, and the soul is enriched with an abundance of every spiritual gift.

It is offered in the Church for the living and the dead, so that what was instituted for the salvation of all may be for the benefit of all. Yet, in the end, no one can fully express the sweetness of this sacrament, in which spiritual delight is tasted at its very source, and in which we renew the memory of that surpassing love for us which Christ revealed in his passion.

It was to impress the vastness of this love more firmly upon the hearts of the faithful that our Lord instituted this sacrament at the Last Supper. As he was on the point of leaving the world to go to the Father, after celebrating the Passover with his disciples, he left it as a perpetual memorial of his passion. It was the fulfilment of ancient figures and the greatest of all his miracles, while for those who were to experience the sorrow of his departure, it was destined to be a unique and abiding consolation. - **St Thomas Aquinas,** *Opus 57, On the Feast of Corpus Christi*

My name is Michael Rayner. have been a parishioner at Our Lady of Hope my whole life. I wanted to share a little bit about the work I am doing this year with an organisation called NET Ministries Australia and New Zealand. NET stands for National

Evangelisation Teams, and operates through peer with peer ministry. NET's mission is to encourage young people to love Jesus and embrace the church.

At the beginning of this year I was working full-time as a manager at Maccas, and planning to travel to Europe for a few months and go to World Youth Day. All of a sudden I felt a strong call to surrender my plans and go and do NET. In the space of three days, I quit my job, applied for NET and said bve to my family and friends.

I then flew to Australia to spend six weeks being trained to become a Missionary. I am spending the year in Christchurch with a team of four other young people. And so far this year has been life-changing. Playing a part in what is some people's first real encounter with Jesus is absolutely amazing. Some describe it as having front-row seats to watching the Holy Spirit work in kids' hearts. My highlight so far this year would have to be a Confirmation camp we helped run. It was really special to help kids in a transformative part of their faith.

NET is a non-profit organization that runs on the generosity of
