A pearl beyond price


ODAY'S READINGS WEAVE around themes of wisdom, treasure and joy. When asked in a dream what he desires from God, Solomon chooses 'a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil.' God is pleased that Solomon does not seek riches or a long life, so gives him the gift of wisdom (**First Reading**).

The Psalmist asks the Lord for his consoling love. God's law means more to him than precious metals. St Paul explains that the plan now unfolding has been there from the beginning (**Second Reading**). God chose, and called us all to become 'true images of his Son'. God wants all who love him and follow his teaching to share in his glory.

In the **Gospel** Jesus offers three images for God's kingdom: a treasure we find unexpectedly; a pearl for which we search diligently; a net that gathers us in. They illustrate the priceless

value and importance of the kingdom to which all are invited. Jesus also reminds us to hold on to treasures both old and new as we seek God's kingdom.

This week, we ponder God's gift of wisdom. We pray that it will guide us to the 'treasure': the delight of knowing and loving Jesus, and the riches this brings. We ask God's help to share that with those we encounter, however we can.



EVER ANCIENT, EVER NEW

For whom he foreknew, he also predestinated to be made conformable to the image of his Son; that he might be the firstborn amongst many brethren. - Romans 8:29 [Second Reading]

OT ALL WHO are called are called according to God's purpose, for the purpose relates to God's foreknowledge and predestination. God only predestined those whom he knew would believe and follow the call. Paul refers to them as the "elect". For many do not come, even though they have been called, but no one comes who has not been called.

We should understand our Lord as "only begotten" in one sense and as "firstborn" in another. Christ is called "only begotten" because he has no brothers and is the Son of God by nature, the Word in the beginning by whom all things were made. But by his assumption of humanity and by the dispensation of the incarnation, through which even we who are not sons by nature have been called into the adoption of sons, he is said to be the "firstborn" of many brothers. For before him there was no resurrection of the dead ... but now after him comes the resurrection of many saints, whom he does not hesitate to call "brothers" because he shares in their common humanity. - **St Augustine of Hippo**

PASSIONIST FAMILY GROUP MOVEMENT

Approximately 25 years ago the Passionist Family Group Movement was established in our Parish. We had around 10-12 groups. However, over time this has fallen into abevance.

What is Passionist Family Group Movement?

The emphasis is on building relationships and creating a sense of belonging among members of the parish. Groups are formed of approximately 24 to 40 people including children, who are encouraged to

meet once a month for a low cost or no cost activity such as pot luck dinners, picnics, games nights or film evenings. It is about developing friendships and support as a family.

The Parish is looking at resurrecting the Movement and needs people who would be willing to be the Co-ordinators. Parish Co-ordinators get to know the people in the groups and make connections from group to group, listen to stories and welcome anyone who comes into the community.

If you think you would like to be Co-ordinators, Paul Traynor from the Passionist Family Group Movement is willing to come and meet with you and explain what the role involves.
