The adoration of the mortals

HILE IN LISBON for the World Youth Day, Pope Francis made an urgent call to recover the "prayer of adoration". The Pope is talking about the practice of *Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament* that we do here also in our Parish every Wednesday, from 9.30am till 9.00pm.

Adoration is to be "silent" before the Lord. The Pope cites the example of St Teresa of Calcutta who never gave up Adoration even when pressed with concerns of life and even in moments of doubt. It is during this time of Adoration that we get the strength to go on our mission of announcing the Gospel and leave behind the "spiritual worldliness" that engenders clericalism, as well as "clericalized laymen who are worse than priests", he said.

Today, we celebrate the **Transfiguration of the Lord**. Towards the end of the Gospel selection, we read how God the Father admonished Peter to "listen" to His beloved Son. How many times in the past, in our prayers, we did all the talking and less of the listening to God in silence? How some of our prayers are reduced to mere recitation of things we want from God!

Some years ago, I and my colleagues were in the place where the gospel this Sunday happened: Mt Tabor, in Israel. I can't adequately describe the experience. Our vocal prayers seem to be out of place in those sacred places of the Holy Land, and so we just did what we mortals can: adore the Lord in sacred silence.

About the meme attached. The hunter is praying to God to give the lion a Christian mind (pensée chrétienne); and so the lion says, "My God, thank you for this meal!"

Gratitude is one of the defining characters of a Christian. Thus, the Lord wants us to celebrate in His memory the sacrament of the Eucharist (in biblical Greek literally means "thanksgiving"), where He becomes present as the Bread of Life that we can adore even while here on earth.

EVER ANCIENT, EVER NEW

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them. - Mt 17:1-2 [Gospel]



HIS IS THE festival of Christ that has drawn us here. Let us listen, then, to the sacred voice of God so compellingly calling us from on high, from the summit of the mountain, so that with the Lord's chosen disciples we may penetrate the deep meaning of these holy mysteries, so far beyond our capacity to express.

Jesus goes before us to show us the way, both up the mountain and into heaven, and - I speak boldly - it is for us now to follow him with all speed, yearning for the heavenly vision that will give us a share in his radiance, renew our spiritual nature and transform us into his own likeness, making us for ever sharers in his Godhead and raising us to heights as yet undreamed of.

Let us run with confidence and joy to enter into the cloud like Moses and Elijah, or like James and John. Let us be caught up like Peter to behold the divine vision and to be transfigured by that glorious transfiguration. Let us retire from the world, stand aloof from the earth, rise above the body, detach ourselves from creatures and turn to the creator, to whom Peter in ecstasy exclaimed: *Lord, it is good for us to be here.* - From a sermon on the transfiguration of the Lord by **Anastasius of Sinai, bishop**


Samoan Mass will be held at St Pius X Church, Titahi Bay at 11am on **Sunday 6 August -** All welcome



PASSIONIST FAMILY GROUP MOVEMENT

Approximately 25 years ago the Passionist Family Group Movement was established in our Parish. We had around 10-12 groups. However, over time this has fallen into abeyance.



The emphasis is on building relationships and creating a sense of belonging among members of the parish. Groups are formed of approximately 24 to 40 people including children, who are encouraged to meet once a month for a low cost or no cost activity

such as pot luck dinners, picnics, games nights or film evenings. It is about developing friendships and support as a family.

The Parish is looking at resurrecting the Movement and needs people who would be willing to be the Co-ordinators. Parish Co-ordinators get to know the people in the groups and make connections from group to group, listen to stories and welcome anyone who comes into the community.
