You must love your neighbour as yourself

HE THEME OF listening runs through today's readings. We are to listen to the word of God, to our hearts, to one another, and to our community. We are challenged truly to love one another, speaking out where necessary. Just as Jesus became our brother and made himself responsible for us, he asks that we do the same.

God appoints Ezekiel as his sentry: a mouthpiece to sound a warning when danger appears. We, too, are to be on the look out, helping one another rather than simply looking on. (First Reading) The **Gospel** echoes this. Jesus tells us what to do when things go wrong in relationships within a community. We should try to work things out one-to-one, then invite those we can trust to advise, and finally ask the community, bringing back those who stray. Jesus asks us not to give up on people, even when they do not listen to us.

In the **Second Reading** St Paul emphasises that it is love that underpins all our relationships. The ten commandments are summed up in the phrase 'love your neighbour as yourself'. The **Psalm** of praise urges us to listen to the Lord with open hearts.

Today we also celebrate the first Sunday in the Season of Creation. As we embrace the beauty of God's Kingdom, we pray for the grace to be good neighbours to each other and to the whole of creation, restoring and caring for all that God has made.

EVER ANCIENT, EVER NEW

Amen I say to you, whatsoever you shall bind upon earth, shall be bound also in heaven; and whatsoever you shall loose upon earth, shall be loosed also in heaven. - Matthew 18:18 [Gospel]



T IS NOT the one who has called for accountability that is to blame but the one who had not been willing to be persuaded. Do you see how Christ has bound him with a twofold constraint, both by the chastisement here and by the punishment hereafter? He threatens the one punishment to prevent the other from happening. Thus, by fearing both rejection from the church and the threat of being bound in heaven, he may become better behaved.

And knowing these things, if not at the beginning, at any rate through so many judgements he will put off his anger. For this reason, Jesus set up a first and a second and a third judging. He does not immediately cut him down, so that if he does not obey the first, he may still yield to the second. But if he rejects that too, he may still respect the third. But if he takes no account of this third danger, let him be terrified of future punishment, of God's sentence and vengeance. - **St John Chrysostom**, *Homily on the Gospel of Matthew*
