

Speaking of the Dead

HE COMMEMORATION OF the faithful departed during the month of November reminds us of our mortality and beyond. In the Eucharistic Prayer III for Requiem Mass, the priest utters "He will raise up in the flesh those who have died and transform our lowly body after the pattern of his own glorious body."

Just what is this glorious body? Of course, it refers to the resurrected glorified body of Jesus, as St Paul writes in Phil 3:21. Saint Thomas Aquinas, speculating on this topic, distinguished some qualities of the resurrected body. Below is a summary of his thought as found in his *Supplement* to the Summa Theologiae, articles 82-85, which is quite daunting to read as they are long.

1. Incapability of suffering *(impassabilitas)* sorrow, sickness, or death (cf Rev 7:16; 21:4)

2. Subtility (*subtilitas*): that is, a spiritualised nature (not an ethereal body) but similar to the spiritualised body of the risen Christ that was able to emerge from a sealed tomb and enter closed door (cf Lk 24:39; Jn 19:26).

3. Agility (*agilitas*): the ability of the body to obey the soul with greatest ease of movement and speed, as shown by the risen body of Christ which suddenly appeared among the apostles and disappeared as quickly (cf Jn 20:19.26; Lk 24:31).

4. Clarity (*claritas*): being filled with beauty and radiance, as Jesus said that "the just shall shine as the sun in the kingdom of the Father" (Mt 13:43), and as shown by his transfiguration (Mt 17:2). The grade of the transfiguration will vary depending on the merits of the soul; 1 Cor 15:41 ff).

Setting aside the corporeal benefits, interesting as they are, there is a more important thing to look forward to; as the Church reminds us in the Last Days, we hope to be reunited with our loved ones and with the angels and the saints. For eternity.
