APPY CHURCH NEW Year, that is. The **Church Calendar** reveals the pattern of our lives; nah, the pattern of our supposedly sanctified lives.

Look closely at our Church calendar and you will see the **history of salvation** being replayed before our very eyes: in **Advent**, we make the longings of the prophets and God's people our own as they prepare for the coming of the promised Messiah; **Christmas** season conveys to us the joy the birth of the Messiah brings.

The season in **Ordinary Time** (First Part) after Christmas with its lessons about the Kingdom sets us to that time when Jesus prepares his disciples during his short public ministry to look towards his coming self-offering. **Lenten Season** brings us closer to His Suffering and Death, as he accomplishes the Father's will—because he loves us—even unto death on the cross; but with **Easter Season**, we celebrate his victory over sin and death through his Resurrection and Ascension.

With the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, we are being "sent" into the world during the **Ordinary Time** (Second Part) to bear witness to our faith while we await the end of times where Jesus will come again as Christ the King to judge the living and the dead. The feasts and solemnities imbedded in the calendar teach us about the saints and the mysteries of our faith.

"Our calendar is our catechism," Rabbi Samson Raphael Hirsch replied when asked why the Jews do not have a catechism. His answer speaks for us, too; for, the Church Calendar, with its repetitions and cycles, makes the sacred lessons sink more easily and deeply into our lives. The Holy Spirit at work in the Church who is our *mater et magistra* (mother and teacher), knew exactly how to nurture and educate our stubborn human nature.

We may have been unfaithful and faltering these past days, months, and years, but in God there is always a new beginning—that the history of salvation we relive year after year may find

its completion in our own lives.

THE CATECHISM CONNECTION

Here, some paragraphs from **the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)** are presented because they cite, or allude to, or treat topics found in the liturgical readings. We, therefore, encourage you to read them with the Catechism that we may grow deeper in our understanding of our Faith.

CCC 35: God gives humanity grace to accept Revelation and welcome the Messiah

AN'S FACULTIES MAKE him capable of coming to a knowledge of the existence of a personal God. But for man to be able to enter into real intimacy with him, God willed both to reveal himself to man and to give him the grace of being able to welcome this revelation in faith. The proofs of God's existence, however, can predispose one to faith and help one to see that faith is not opposed to reason.

CCC 672: The final tribulation and Christ's return in glory

EFORE HIS ASCENSION Christ affirmed that the hour had not yet come for the glorious establishment of the messianic kingdom awaited by Israel which, according to the prophets, was to bring all men the definitive order of justice, love and peace. According to the Lord, the present time is the time of the Spirit and of witness, but also a time still marked by "distress" and the trial of evil which does not spare the Church and ushers in the struggles of the last days. It is a time of waiting and watching.



The Jesse tree helps us connect the custom of decorating Christmas trees to the events leading to Jesus' birth. The Jesse tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out of the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of King David. We adorn a Jesse tree with

illustrated ornaments that represent the people, prophesies, and events leading up to the birth of Jesus. The ornaments of the Jesse tree tell the story of God in the Old Testament, connecting the Advent season with the faithfulness of God across four thousand years of history.

1st week of Advent

Adam and Eve - Ornament: Tree with Fruit or Apple - Genesis 2:4-24

Noah - Ornament: Rainbow or Ark - Genesis 6-9

You are encouraged to celebrate the weeks leading up to Christmas with an Advent wreath which can be used as a focal point for your daily devotions.




ADVENT WREATH BLESSING


