

#### 2nd SUNDAY OF ADVENT, YEAR B - 10 DECEMBER 2023

#### Homoousios vs Homoiousios

ONSUBSTANTIAL IS THE English word used to translate the Greek "homoousios", which literally means "of the same substance". Its usage was once a subject of intense theological debate connected with the nature and identity of Jesus Christ.

For the first time in the Church's existence, one of its fundamental beliefs, the divine nature of Christ, was put into question by Arius who taught that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is a creature and therefore neither coeternal nor coequal to the Father.

The resulting controversy was so divisive that it began to tear the empire apart, prompting Emperor Constantine to summon all bishops to Nicaea in 325AD (St Nicholas was one of 318 who attended). It must be noted that Constantine, a supporter of Arius but served as council moderator, wasn't involved in the debate or voting process. He would later order all Arian books to be burned.

One of the attendees, St Athanasius, argued from Scriptures and from the Church's practice of having Jesus Christ, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, as an object of worship since the time of the Apostles. The Incarnation and the saving Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, and his mandate for people to be baptised "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit (Mt 28:19)" wouldn't make sense if the Trinitarian doctrine is not true.

"Consubstantial" (homoousios) was added in our Creed specifically to counteract the dangerous doctrine of Arius. Later on, the Arians sought to compromise and proposed another term, homoiousios (of similar substance). Just an iota of difference to some, but not for Athanasius who saw how it threatened the integrity of the faith as handed down by the apostles. The texts we use in the Nicene Creed (Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed, if you

prefer a mouthful) was actually approved and elaborated upon in 381AD at the Council of Constantinople, this time with St Gregory of Nazianzus as presider.

Blessings + for you as we prepare for the Nativity of Jesus Christ, "true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, born of the Virgin Mary". — Fr Rico

#### THE CATECHISM CONNECTION

Here, some paragraphs from **the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)** are presented because they cite, or allude to, or treat topics found in the liturgical readings. We, therefore, encourage you to read them with the Catechism that we may grow deeper in our understanding of our Faith.

#### CCC 522:

HE COMING OF God's Son to earth is an event of such immensity that God willed to prepare for it over centuries. He makes everything converge on Christ all the rituals and sacrifices, figures and symbols of the "First Covenant". He announces him through the mouths of the prophets who succeeded one another in Israel. Moreover, he awakens in the hearts of the pagans a dim expectation of this coming.

#### CCC 719:

OHN THE BAPTIST is "more than a prophet." In him, the Holy Spirit concludes his speaking through the prophets. John completes the cycle of prophets begun by Elijah. He proclaims the imminence of the consolation of Israel; he is the "voice" of the Consoler who is coming. As the Spirit of truth will also do, John "came to bear witness to the light." In John's sight, the Spirit thus brings to completion the careful search of the prophets and fulfils the longing of the angels."

#### CCC 1042:

T THE END of time, the Kingdom of God will come in its fullness. After the universal judgment, the righteous will reign for ever with Christ, glorified in body and soul.






#### ADVENT RECONCILIATION
