We are created in Christ Jesus to live the good life

HIS FOURTH SUNDAY of Lent is traditionally known as "Laetare (Rejoice!) Sunday', and our readings today suggest many reasons for rejoicing. The **First Reading** from Chronicles describes the destruction of Jerusalem and the days of exile. But God, working through the Persian king, Cyrus, not only brings the Jewish people home to where they belong but also helps them rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem.

St Paul (**Second Reading**) writes that God, whose nature is Universal Love, brought us back to life in and with Christ Jesus through the gift of his infinite grace. Our good works and our lives lived in all their fullness are a grateful and authentic response to all we have been given by God.

The **Gospel** tells us that the resurrection of Christ Jesus, who was 'lifted up and exalted' on the cross, brings salvation to all who believe in him and in his teachings. Christ's Passion, for all its injustice and brutality, is a glorious revelation of God's love for all of humankind, and the source of our healing. Jesus calls us to live by his truth and light, where we can dwell in the flow of God's energy and love.

The **Psalm** of lament recalls the bitter days of exile in Babylon. For us today, 'Babylon" can stand as a symbol for all that threatens the fullness of human living. Hatred, selfishness, greed, and pride can all take us away from wholeness of life and into

exile.

This week, we pray for the personal faith and humility to be open to God's infinite grace and light. We pray, too, that all of humanity might be open and receptive to God's life-giving energy.

THE CATECHISM CONNECTION - 4th Sunday of Lent

Here, some paragraphs from **the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)** are presented because they cite, or allude to, or treat topics found in the liturgical readings. We, therefore, encourage you to read them with the Catechism that we may grow deeper in our understanding of our Faith.

CCC 710:

HE FORGETTING OF the Law and the infidelity to the covenant end in death: it is the Exile, apparently the failure of the promises, which is in fact the mysterious fidelity of the Saviour God and the beginning of a promised restoration, but according to the Spirit. The People of God had to suffer this purification.⁷⁷ In Gods plan, the Exile already stands in the shadow of the Cross, and the Remnant of the poor that returns from the Exile is one of the most transparent prefiguration's of the Church.


