I will write my Law on their hearts

HIS SUNDAY'S READINGS encourage us to turn towards growth and transformation out of pain and suffering. The prophet Jeremiah makes a great proclamation: 'See, the days are coming .. when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel'. God's eternal covenant of love and forgiveness is written deep within our hearts (**First Reading**).

It is because of this same promise, that Christ became human to share with us in our suffering, forever praying for us and with us (**Second Reading**). In Christ, all suffering and death are transfigured into growth and new life through his resurrection. This Sunday's **Psalm** would have been familiar to Jesus as he prayed for us during his time on earth, earnestly encouraging us to turn from our sinful ways towards God's love and compassion.

In the **Gospe**l, Jesus speaks of the personal suffering and death that he will soon be facing. He knows that he could ask his Father to save him from this fate, but instead he willingly makes a choice that leads to our salvation.

Jesus invites us to follow his way of living. It is not an easy path to travel, but Christ is always with us, helping and sustaining us.

Let us pray for each other that through God's infinite grace, we will remain true to the law of love that is written deep within us.

THE CATECHISM CONNECTION - 5th Sunday of Lent

Here, some paragraphs from **the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)** are presented because they cite, or allude to, or treat topics found in the liturgical readings. We, therefore, encourage you to read them with the Catechism that we may grow deeper in our understanding of our Faith.

CCC 606:

HE SON OF God, who came down "from heaven, not to do [his] own will, but the will of him who sent [him]", 413 said on coming into the world, "Lo, I have come to do your will, O God." "And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." From the first moment of his Incarnation the Son embraces the Father's plan of divine salvation in his redemptive mission: "My food is to do the will of him who sent me, and to accomplish his work." The sacrifice of Jesus "for the sins of the whole world" expresses his loving communion with the Father. "The Father loves me, because I lay down my life", said the Lord, "[for] I do as the Father has commanded me, so that the world may know that I love the Father."

GUIDE TO THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

During Confession

- 1 You can begin your confession by making the sign of the cross and saying: "Bless me father, for I have sinned."
- The priest gives you a blessing and you may continue with: "My last good confession was ... (how many weeks, months or years approximately)."
- 3 Say the sins that you remember. Start with the one that is most difficult to say, after this it will be easier to mention the rest. Sin declared is half-conquered, according to St Francis de Sales.
- 4 If you do not know how to confess, feel uneasy or ashamed, simply ask the priest to assist you. Be assured he will help you make a good confession. Simply answer the questions without hiding anything out of shame or fear. Place your trust in God: he is your merciful Father and wants to forgive you through His ministers (see Jn 20:23; 2 Cor 5:18).
- 5 If you do not remember any serious sins, be sure to confess at least some of your venial sins, adding at the end: "I am sorry for these and all the sins of my past life, especially for ... (mention in general any past sin for which you are particularly sorry, for example all my sins against charity, purity, etc)."
- 6 The priest will assign you some penance and give you some advice to help you to be a better Christian. If you are not sure how to go about with your penance, don't be afraid to tell the priest. Some priests would ask you to recite the *Act of Contrition* (see over the different versions) as he gives you the absolution.
- 7 Listen to the words of the absolution attentively. At the end answer: "Amen". Be willing to do the penance as soon as possible. This penance will diminish the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven.
